- CLOTH FACE COVERINGS (MASKS) ARE TO BE WORN BY EVERYONE (EXCEPT THOSE UNDER TWO YEARS OF AGE) WHILE INSIDE THE CHURCH.
- PLEASE AVOID SOCIALIZING BEFORE AND AFTER MASS IN ORDER TO MAINTAIN SOCIAL DISTANCING AND TO AVOID PHYSICAL CONTACT (HANDSHAKE OR HUGS).
- FAMILIES AND THOSE RESIDING IN THE SAME HOUSEHOLD CAN SIT TOGETHER. OTHER PARTICIPANTS ARE ASKED TO MAINTAIN THE 6-FOOT SELF-DISTANCING RULE WHILE SEATED IN THE PEWS.
- THE COLLECTION BASKET IS IN THE NARTHEX WHERE YOUR OFFERING MAY BE PLACED BEFORE OR AFTER MASS.
- THE SIGN OF PEACE WILL NOT TAKE PLACE AND PARISHIONERS WILL NOT HOLD HANDS DURING THE PRAYING OF THE OUR FATHER.
- HOLY COMMUNION (BODY OF CHRIST) WILL BE DISTRIBUTED AT 3 STATIONS IN THE CHURCH. AN USHER WILL DIRECT YOU, SINGLE FILE WITH 6-FOOT DISTANCING (INDICATED ON THE FLOOR), TO THE COMMUNION STATION. WE ASK THAT YOU RECEIVE IN THE HAND ONLY (NO GLOVES). PLEASE APPLY HAND SANITIZER BEFORE THE RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION. SANITIZER IS AVAILABLE IN BOTH THE NARTHEX AND INSIDE CHURCH.
- WHEN MASS IS CONCLUDED, PLEASE REMAIN IN YOUR SEAT UNTIL AN USHER DISMISSES YOUR ROW. CONGREGATING OR SOCIALIZING AFTER MASS IS NOT PERMITTED AT THIS TIME DUE TO SAFE DISTANCING CONCERNS.

and crushing rocks before the LORD—

GOSPEL

MT 14:22-33

After he had fed the people, Jesus made the disciples get into a boat  
and precede him to the other side,  
while he dismissed the crowds.

After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray.  
When it was evening, he was there alone.

Meanwhile the boat, already a few miles offshore,  
was being tossed about by the waves, for the wind was against it.

During the fourth watch of the night,  
he came toward them walking on the sea.

When the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified.  
“It is a ghost,” they said, and they cried out in fear.

At once Jesus spoke to them, “Take courage, it is I; do not be  
afraid.” Peter said to him in reply, “Lord, if it is you, command me  
to come to you on the water.” He said, “Come.”

Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward  
Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was, he became  
frightened; and, beginning to sink, he cried out, “Lord, save me!”  
Immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught Peter,  
and said to him, “O you of little faith, why did you doubt?”

After they got into the boat, the wind died down.  
Those who were in the boat did him homage, saying,  
“Truly, you are the Son of God.”

PROFESSION *of* FAITH

NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father, Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.
