The Church's fasting regulations strengthen us in our battles against temptation and unite us with Christ and all who are suffering from a lack of basic necessities. suffer.

**Fasting** is observed by everyone 18 yrs. of age and older, who has not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, enough to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but consuming liquids, including milk and juices, is allowed.

**Abstinence** is observed by everyone 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or the ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday are days of abstinence. If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, other suitable forms of self-denial are encouraged.



**T** very Catholic knows Lent begins with ashes smudged on our foreheads. Lent also begins with direct orders from Jesus Christ about how we are to behave as his disciples: PRAY, FAST, GIVE.

What we often overlook is his command to perform these actions in stealth mode:

• "When you **give alms**, do not let your left hand know when your right is doing so that you almsgiving may be secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you." (Mt. 6:6)

"When you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face so that you may not appear to others to be fasting...." (Mt. 6:16a, 17)



 When you pray, "go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you." (Mt. 16:6)

ur tagline for Lent 2024 is "Find your Holy Place." In other words, resolve now to dedicate a time and a place each day for holiness. This is where you will pause, call upon God's presence, lift your heart and pray.

Coincidentally, Pope Francis on Jan. 24 declared 2024 as the "Year of Prayer" in preparation for the Jubilee Year of 2025. The other side of this sheet lists how we as a faith community will follow the spiritual disciplines of Lent based on Christ's instructions to fast, give alms and pray—especially with and in the Eucharist.

In the words of Pope Francis, let us pray, "above all else, to renew our desire to be in the presence of the Lord, to listen to him and adore him." **And, let us pray for one another on our shared journey to Easter and beyond.**
