

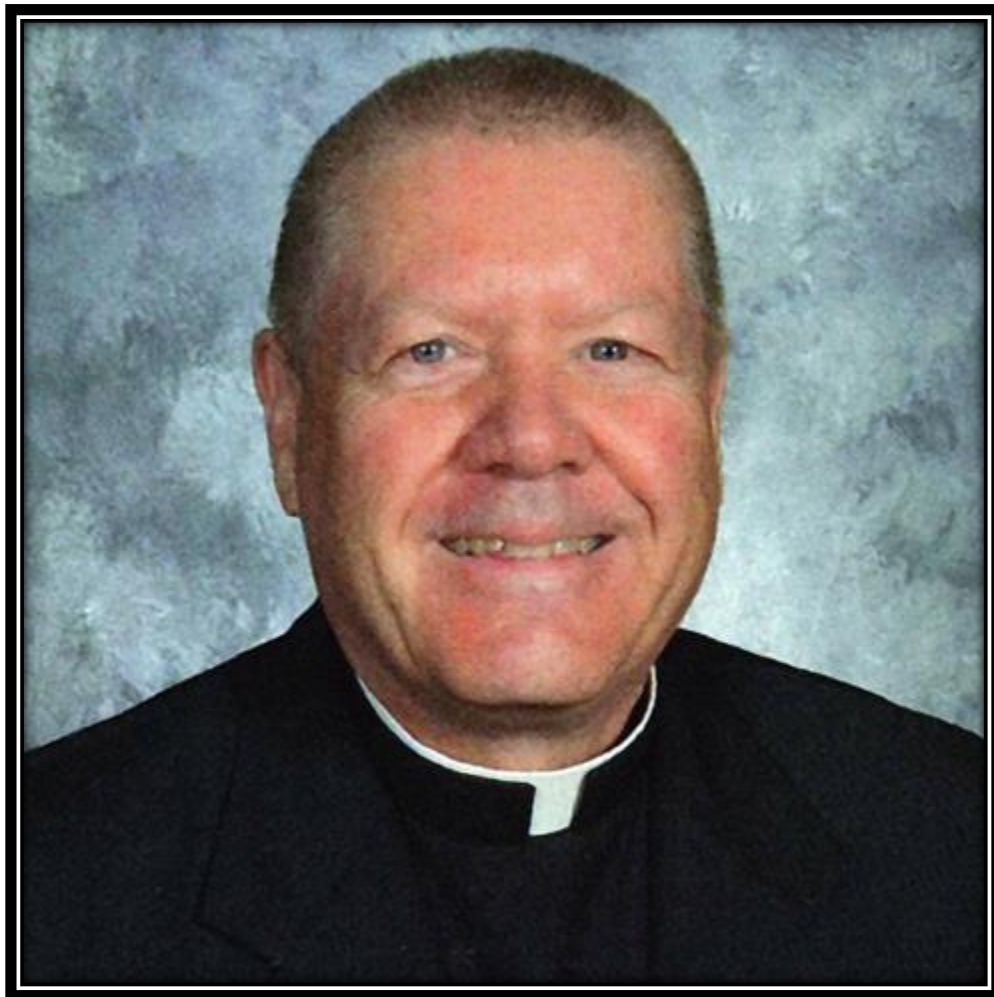

THE COLLECTION BASKET IS IN THE NARTHEX WHERE YOUR OFFERING MAY BE PLACED BEFORE OR AFTER MASS.

THE SIGN OF PEACE WILL NOT TAKE PLACE AND PARISHIONERS WILL NOT HOLD HANDS DURING THE PRAYING OF THE OUR FATHER.

HOLY COMMUNION WILL BE DISTRIBUTED AT 3 STATIONS IN CHURCH. AN USHER WILL DIRECT YOU SINGLE FILE TO THE COMMUNION STATION. WE ASK THAT YOU RECEIVE IN THE HAND ONLY, NO GLOVES. PLEASE APPLY HAND SANITIZER BEFORE THE RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION.

WHEN MASS HAS CONCLUDED PLEASE EXIT CHURCH IN AN ORDERLY FASHION.

REMINDER: CONGREGATING OR SOCIALIZING AFTER MASS IN CHURCH OR NARTHEX IS NOT PERMITTED AT THIS TIME.

## LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading:

Isaiah 25:6-10A

On this mountain the LORD of hosts will provide for all peoples a feast of rich food and choice wines, juicy, rich food and pure, choice wines. On this mountain he will destroy the veil that veils all peoples, the web that is woven over all nations; he will destroy death forever. The Lord GOD will wipe away

the tears from every face; the reproach of his people he will remove from the whole earth; for the LORD has spoken .On that day it will be said: “Behold our God, to whom we looked to save us! This is the LORD for whom we looked; let us rejoice and be glad that he has saved us!” For the hand of the LORD will rest on this mountain.

Gospel:

Matthew 22:1-14

Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come. A second time he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast.'" Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The

feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.' The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to meet the guests, he saw a man there not dressed in a wedding garment. The king said to him, 'My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?' But he was reduced to silence.
